GREETINGS: In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town qualified to vote in Elections and Town Affairs therein, to meet at the Scituate High School Gymnasium, 606 Chief Justice Cushing Highway on

At seven o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. Acquisition of Pier 44

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to purchase, take by eminent domain, or otherwise acquire a parcel of land identified as 44 Jericho Road, shown on Assessors' Maps as Map 45, Block 12, parcels 1 and 1B, containing 1.030 acres more or less and known as the Pier 44 property, said acquisition to be funded with monies available under a land acquisition fund granted to the Town by the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority under the Greenbush Mitigation Agreement, and further that the Town authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into such agreements, including without limitation, use restrictions on said property, as the Board deems to be in the best interest of the Town to effectuate said acquisition, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 2. Wampatuck Elementary School Repairs
266 Tilden Road, Scituate, MA 02066

To see if the Town of Scituate will vote to appropriate, borrow or transfer from available funds, the sum of \$2,330,000.00, or a greater or lesser sum, to be expended under the direction of the Scituate School Building Committee for professional fees, repairing, improving and equipping the Wampatuck Elementary School, 266 Tilden Road, Scituate, Massachusetts 02066, for which the Town may be eligible for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA), said program being a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and provided that any costs the Town of Scituate incurs in connection with the feasibility study in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the Town of Scituate or take any other action relative thereto.
